Poultry Culling Proves Effective.

That the culling of poultry flocks is not only effective but immensely practical, was clearly shown in the culling done by Prof. Brewster at the culling demonstration meetings held in this county two weeks since.



Reports have so far been received from only one of the flocks culled, that of F. J. Lewis, at Banks. In this

flock there were 210 birds from which 31 were culled. The week following the date of the culling, the 31 hens which were kept to themselves laid only five eggs, while the balance of the flock produced practically the same number as before.
