In the year of 1888, when this north end of the county was comparatively a void as far as inhabitants were concerned, there came over the trail from Enterprise a man of determination and zeal equal to the occasion who throughout many trials and discouragements, carved a way to success and prosperity here in this strange yet beautiful land.

Ed. Renfrow, one of our earliest inhabitants, came over the incline of yonder barrier of mountains with all precious keepsakes carefully stowed away in the sled box, for snow lay deep upon the ground with night coming on before the incline which slopes to this north land was scarcely passed and with a disabled sled he toiled on until water was reached. Here he camped for the night and the old sled was laid aside never to rise again. Before him lay a wilderness, parts of which had never been trod by the feet of white man, but undaunted, he traveled on until under the shadow of the lofty banks of the Grande Ronde river, with its soothing song ringing in his ears, he filed his homestead right on the place now owned by Newt Estes. In this year, came also as companions in sacrifice, Robert Wright and Asa Brown to share with him the preparation of straight paths for the many who would soon come pouring over the divide. We bid adieu to Mr. Renfrow and his faithful wife, with deep

regrets, hoping that the new home in Forest Grove, towards which they journey, with its many added allurements, will not blot from their memory the many royal friends still residents of this north country. As we take our children upon our knees and they ask about Sled Springs, we shall tell them the story of the old sled, bleaching yonder under the weight of the many years and of that hardy pioneer, Ed Renfrow, who dared the toil and sacrifice, that this, then a wilderness, might be made to blossom with the rose.
