For if the sewer system is decided upon later, the cost of its construction must be met by the owner of a septic tank the same as by his neighbor who has none. If septic tanks were put in every home, no doubt the necessity of an expensive sewer system may be postponed for several years, if not for all time. But let the plan be for the community and thus look forward either to requiring the septic tank on every property, or plan the installation of a sewer system by such time as the need may seem imperative.
