What The Iron Horse Will Do

With only one man operating both tractor and implement or vehicle, the Iron Horse will handle a 2- or 3-horse grain drill, a single disc, a harrow, the mower, the corn planter, 2-row corn cultivator, bean and sugar-beet cultivator, the corn binder, a 3-horse plow, the hay rake or tedder, wagon with hay loader, road drag and road scraper, small road grader, will haul stone boat, small timbers. Is also ideal for doing all kinds of chores requiring team and wagon. Ideal for All Kinds of Cultivating

The machine is not heavy, will not crush down or pack the ground because all four wheels pull and provide traction.
