METHODIST CHURCH REPORT SHOWS 36,622,199 ADHERENTS
A census of Methodists, compiled by Dr. H. H. Carroll, formerly of the census bureau, for the centenary convention committee of the Methodist Episcopal church, shows 36,622,199 Methodists in the world, according to figures just made public.
There are 9,832,107 members of the church, the remainder being adherents and probationers who are members of Methodist families. The increase in the total of Methodists during the last nine years is given as 3,935,841.

Pioneer Dies
Hillsboro dispatch to Wednesday's Oregonian says: R. A. D. Meek, of North Plains has received word of the death on October 24, at Graysland, Idaho, of his brother, Joseph Lane Meek. Deceased was a son of the pioneer, Joseph Meek, and was born in Washington county, October 8, 1855. He was married June 25, 1895, to Miss Katherine Anderson and the same year moved to Idaho, where he farmed on an extensive scale and was active in politics. He is survived by his widow and seven children, a brother, S. A. D. Meek, and a sister, Mrs. Olive Riley, of Eugene.

FORMER CITIZEN DROPS DEAD AT SHERIDAN
Saturday night's Portland Journal carried the following dispatch from Sheridan, which relates the death of a former well-known Forest Grove citizen who moved from this place a number of years ago:
"Waiting for a Portland Democrat to arrive to address a political meeting, Z. M. LaRue, 62 years old, dropped dead while praising United States Senator Chamberlain.
"Mr. LaRue had resided in Sheridan since March, 1915, operating a furniture store. He was formerly a partner of Fred Thomas, local undertaker. He was born in Oregon and for years lived at Forest Grove. His wife and a daughter, Mrs. Alfred Ivin, of Sheridan, survive."
