

PLANS ARE MADE FOR SALE OF CHRISTMAS SEALS

The Oregon Tuberculosis Association, under the direction of the executive secretary, Mrs. Sadie Orr-Dunbar, is organizing its forces throughout the state for the annual sale of Christmas Seals.

The Public Health Associations will conduct the sale in the eleven counties where they exist; they are Jackson, Coos, Lane, Washington, Clackamas, Hood River, Union, Harney, Curry, Multnomah.

The budget for use in 1921 is \$35,000 and through the sale of the Christmas seals at a cent a piece, this sum will be sought.

Four and a half million seals have been received by the Oregon Association. The 1920 Seal features a tiny green elf, who carries aloft the standard of the Anti-Tuberculosis Association.

To the Clerk of School District No. 48, Washington County, Oregon: Following is a statement of the estimated amount of money needed by the district during the fiscal year beginning on June 21st, 1920, and ending on June 30, 1921. This budget is made in compliance with Section 217 of the School Laws of 1917, and includes the estimated amounts to be received from the county school fund, state school fund, special district tax and all other moneys of the district:
