**STATE RECEIVES VAST SUM
FROM MOTOR FUEL USERS**

A Salem dispatch says that a total of 44,900,666 gallons of gasoline and 2,721,717 gallons of distillate were consumed in motor vehicles in Oregon during 1920, on which users paid a state tax aggregating \$402,615.33, according to a summary prepared by Secretary of State Kozor this morning.

The table which covers the 22 months in which the motor fuel oil tax has been in operation, shows a total of 76,754,653 gallons of gasoline and 7,402,463.75 gallons of distillate consumed in that time, with taxes aggregating \$804,658.91 reverting to the state's good road fund through this medium.

The peak load of gasoline sales was recorded in August, both for 1919 and 1920, with 4,346,958.5 gallons consumed in August, 1919, and 5,289,389 gallons used in August, 1920.
