## UNWILLING TO REGISTER.

The San Francisco Examiner says that the Chinese announce their intention more bitterly than ever to fight the registration clauses of the Geary Act. The Registration Act is to be fought by the Six companies—the most powerful Chinese organization—because it will shut off the profitable business of smuggling coolies into the United States. It is estimated that an average of 20 Chinese a day, or over 7000 a year, are in one way or another smuggled into this country. The most of them come in by the Canadian border and the Puget Sound route. Others come in as the fifteen came ashore from the Haleyon at Pescadero the other day. The traffic goes on without ceasing, and the occasional captures made give it hardly a check. A large proportion of the captures, indeed, amount to nothing from a failure of proof that the smuggled coolies were not lawfully in the country.

The registration and grant of certificates will furnish a short and easy method of determining whether a Chinese is lawfully in this country or not. That is why it is fought by the Six Companies.

The sentimental and hysterical objections made to the law are hardly worth serious consideration. Registration and the requirement of certificates are no more degrading to the Chinese than are the passport regulations of the European governments to the American who visits them. No white person feels degraded because he has to show his passport when he crosses the German frontier from France or is required to register before he can have the privilege of remaining in a German city. The passport regulations of Russia though more strict by far than the registration clauses of the Geary Act are not considered to lower the persons against whom they are directed, however annoying they may be to travelers.

The right of a country to make and enforce such regulations in regard to aliens has never been doubted. The law will be pronounced constitutional, and the Chinese who do not obey it will have to go. The law does not interfere with the privileges of freedom of those now here. It is intended only to prevent any addition to their numbers. The Chinese who do not want to be sent back to China should take an early opportunity to register.

## THE GREAT DAILY SEES DEFEAT.

Oregonian: If the republican party fail to elect the president in November, the failure will be due solely to the inactivity and indifference of the republicans of the country. During forty years no one has witnessed a presidential contest so tame and tame as the present is, in fact, hardly a contest at all. Nor is it a spiritless canvass on the part of republicans alone. Many democrats are similarly indifferent. Inactivity on one side produces its effect of inactivity on the other. Nevertheless, at the end of a dull campaign the democratic party is very likely to have the advantage, because that party contains a greater number of steady voters—of men who like to vote for the diversion and excitement attending it; who vote merely for the sake of voting—than the republican party contains. Hence, if the whole vote is not called out at an election, the democratic party, casting a greater proportion of its vote than the republican, is very likely to win.
