CLEVELAND'S CABINET.

So far, the following persons have been offered and accepted cabinet positions: Walter Q. Gresham of Illinois, secretary of state; John G. Carlisle of Kentucky, secretary of the treasury; Daniel S. Lamont of New York, secretary of war; Wilson S. Bissell of Buffalo, portmaster-general; Sterling Morton of Nebraska, secretary of agriculture; Geo. A. Jenks of Pennsylvania, attorney-general.

Judge Gresham, who has the highest and most important position in the cabinet, was, until just recently, among the most prominent leaders of the republican party, and nearly received the republican nomination for president four years ago against Harrison.

Mr. Cleveland's position from the first has been that in the selection of a secretary of state he did not propose to stand strictly by party limits. He has all along said that he wanted the best man that could be found in the country.

Of Judge Gresham's great ability and high character there can be no question. He is thoroughly American in all his instincts and training.
