According to a new law which goes into effect on May 21st, the county courts of the several counties of the state will hereafter be required to make a levy, at the same time they levy other taxes, of a tax upon all taxable property in their counties, for school purposes. The levy is to be made upon the per capita as shown by the last preceding school census. The tax thus levied is to be collected in the samy manner, at the same time and by the same officers that other taxes are collected. Another law passed effecting the schools provides that the clerk of the district shall collect the school taxes.


