The highest number of votes cast in this county Monday for any candidate was for state Supt., 891 votes being cast. The highest number cast for county candidates was for sheriff and assessor—869 being cast for each.

We have had several heavy showers of rain during the last week. Everybody will have so much grain that there will not be room on their farms to stack it, and will have to let it hang over onto their neighbor's farms.

Owing to the high waters our regular bundle of paper failed to reach us for this issue, and we are compelled to use an edition which also failed to get here on time last winter. We expect to have our regular weekly supply of paper by next week, however.

Charley Perrin left Tuesday with his harness and saddlery outfit for Antelope, via Leonard's bridge and Moro. Charley is an industrious, deserving young man, and as he is an excellent workman and thorough master of the business, he is sure to succeed in his new enterprise. His many friends in Gilliam county wish him success.

The election is over, and it's a safe bet that 2/3 of the candidates are better satisfied with the result than the other 1/3. There is one thing certain about running for office—all of the candidates cannot win, and it does not show good judgment for the defeated party to get mad about it and paw holes into the atmosphere; they know before getting into the race that it is impossible for all to win.

The Australian ballot system has come to stay. No city or state that has tried it has gone back to the old system, with its bluster, bribery, repeating and false counting. By timely explanation the dullest voter now understands it. Voters deem it a matter of self-pride as well as duty to master the simple details that the law requires. It is worth while to go to a little trouble to insure a free vote and an honest count.

The republicans of Gilliam county have reason to rejoice at their success at Monday's election. It is the most complete victory they have had since the organization of the county, having elected every candidate except sheriff. As our friend O. S. Ebi remarked, "they elected Wilcox also, as he could not have been elected without some republican votes." The vote shows a republican majority in this county of almost 200.

Oscar Portwood returned to Condon Thursday from Salem, where he had been at work a short time in the New York Racket store. The work did not suit him, and he threw up the job. Oscar came by boat as far as The Dalles and rode from there to Schuttler Flat on a freight wagon, that being his only chance for getting through. He says The Columbia and Willamette have consolidated with the Pacific ocean, all of it being one vast body of water.

The raging waters of the Columbia have at last begun to recede, but the railroad track is left in a deplorable condition, and cannot be rebuilt within the next month or so. It will cost the U. P. several millions of dollars to put the track in condition again. We have been shut off from the outside world for two weeks, having had no mail since that time. A steamer has been placed on the river which will transport passengers and mail until the road is repaired. It has caused no end of inconvenience to every business man in this county, and we are all sick of it.

Although we have not yet recovered from a month's siege of pneumonia, we made the "argument" exceedingly warm for him and accommodated him to the best of our ability for about 5 minutes, quitting with honors (?) about even—as pugilists say. The reader will doubtless wonder if there really is any honor at all in such "discussions," and we agree with them that there is not. The recorder assessed each of us at \$15 for the use of the sidewalk during the aforesaid 5-minute debate, which afforded the crowd so much amusement that the boys threw in and paid both fines. We understand letters have been sent to each of the other county papers, painting the fracas in loud colors, and, of course, misrepresenting the facts with a view to making a "mountain out of a mole-hill." But the public will consider the source and treat it accordingly.
