A dispatch from Havana says: Three prisoners of war, Gregorie Birges, Es-taban Hernandez and Jose Pacallao, were executed at Cabana fortress. They belonged to the insurgent band commanded by Dr. Bruno Zayas, and were captured by the soldiers of Asrapiles' battalion during the attack on Managua.

A number of the newspapers of Madrid and elsewhere demand that the elections in Cuba be annulled and expremier Sagasti intends to ask the chamber of deputies to annul the Cuban elections on the ground that the electors, owing to the state of rebellion prevailing, were not free to vote as they pleased.
