It seems almost a miracle that the child was not killed.

The youngest child of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Bennett, whose age is about 7 years, has for about four months been the victim of some very uncommon disease or ailment. After having him examined here by Dr. Shaw of Fossil, his mother took him to Heppner, where two physicians of that place and one from Portland were consulted. The doctors say such cases were very rare, they having record of but two cases in 20 years. The blood vessels seem to be giving way and breaking all through his system, causing blood to flow from his mouth as if bleeding at the lungs. Large black spots are plainly visible in many places over his body where the veins and blood vessels have burst. His physicians are doubtful of his recovery.

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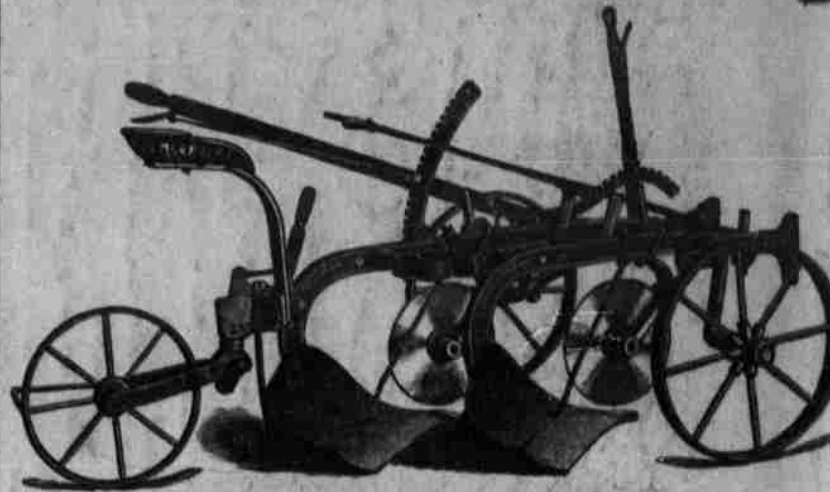
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
