That Olex Road.

[The Globe knows nothing about the merits of the matter treated in the following communication but is always disposed to give both sides to any controversy which may chance to creep into its columns. Ed.]

Noticed in your issue of the 12th inst., in the Olex items, some rubbish which duty to myself and the public demand that I should answer, and in so doing I will give unmistakable proof of the utter falsity of the assertions made by your correspondent.
