THE OFFICIAL PAPER OF GILLIAM COUNTY, OREGON.

HON. W. L. BRADSHAW.

Probably no man has ever filled a judicial office in Oregon who stands higher in public estimation than does Hon. W. L. Bradshaw, judge of the seventh judicial district, and who was the unanimous choice of his party for re-nomination. For seven years he has served as judge of this district, having been appointed to the office in May, 1891, and elected at the June election the following year. During seven years on the bench he has given universal satisfaction both to litigants and attorneys. His decisions have been just and equitable, and have been so nearly in accord with the principles of law that he has seldom been reversed in the supreme court, when appeals from his court have been taken.

Possessed of an active mind and keen preceptive abilities, he dispenses of business before his court very readily, thus confining terms only long enough to give due consideration of causes brought up for trial. During the time he has been on the bench court terms in this district have been of short duration, hence expenses have been reduced to the minimum, though comparatively few cases have been continued from one term to another.

Judge Bradshaw was born in Putnam county, Mo., September 28, 1858, and came to Oregon when seven years of age. His early life was spent at Lafayette, Yamhill county, where he attended the public schools, and afterward was a student in the state agricultural college. In 1879 he entered the St. Louis Law School, graduating from that institution in 1881. Returning to Oregon from Missouri, he associated in the law practice at Lafayette with his father, C. E. Bradshaw, remaining in that city until 1889, when he moved to The Dalles, engaging in practice until appointed judge seven years ago.

His record since that date is almost too well known in this community to require mention. Almost everyone who has had business before the circuit court in the district is personally acquainted with him and considers him a friend.

By his firm, yet courteous rulings in court and the consideration he shows jurors and witnesses, he has won the respect of all, and his unimpeachable integrity and honor are convincing to everybody that he is a safe judicial officer, one whose opinions cannot be swayed by hope of favor or fear of incurring enmity. In his court the humblest citizen and the most influential personage receive the same consideration. All men to him are alike, he having but one purpose to govern his official acts—that to deal justly between man and man and render decisions founded on equity and justice. His experience of seven years on the bench makes him peculiarly fitted for another term, and it will be to the interest of all to return him to the bench another six years.

Sheriff Wilcox received the ballots boxes, poll books and other election supplies last week and has since been busy delivering them to the proper officers of the various precincts. This work constitutes one of the duties of the sheriff's office and it is a noticeable fact that the only tour of the county Mr. Wilcox has made during the campaign has been to perform this work, being seemingly content to leave the matter of his candidacy in the hands of the people. His interests will not suffer by such a course, either, for there seems to be a feeling among the voters, without regard to party, that Mr. Wilcox's treatment of the taxpayers during the period of hard times through which they have passed has been such as to entitle him to their support at next Monday's election. He always exercised the utmost leniency in the collection of taxes, during the period that tax money was hard to get hold of, thereby making it very much easier for many men to weather the storm of financial depression, and there seems to be no doubt in the minds of a majority of the voters as to who will occupy the sheriff's office during the next two years.

The politician, no matter of what political faith, who tells the people that ninety per cent of the Oregon voters are members of the same political party that he is, or that the vote at the coming Oregon election will have the most remote bearing on the matter of the support of the national government by the people of this state in the prosecution of the war, must presume mightily on the ignorance of his auditors. He certainly shows his own to be of alarming proportions.

The fact that the common soldier who carries a musket and does the fighting in this war is paid \$13 a month while the chaplain who preaches a prayer book and does the praying is paid \$125, is pretty good ground for the belief that this government of ours is not at all times just and equitable in rewarding its servants according to their work.
