OBITUARY.

Died, Thursday morning, June 7, 1898, at the residence of his son-in-law, W. S. Myers, two miles west of Condon, John Phillips Esq., at the advanced age of 82 years.

The subject of this sketch was born in Yorkshire, England, September 21, 1815, and was for many years in the service of the Marquis of Normanby, accompanying him for three years to Ireland, and for six years to Paris, France. He was married in 1842 and in 1848 emigrated to America. In 1861 he enlisted in the Union army and served for four years as farrier and veterinary surgeon. After the war he lived for many years at Neodasha, Kansas, and came to Oregon about six years ago where he has since resided. He was one of nature's noblemen, highly respected and much beloved by all who knew him.

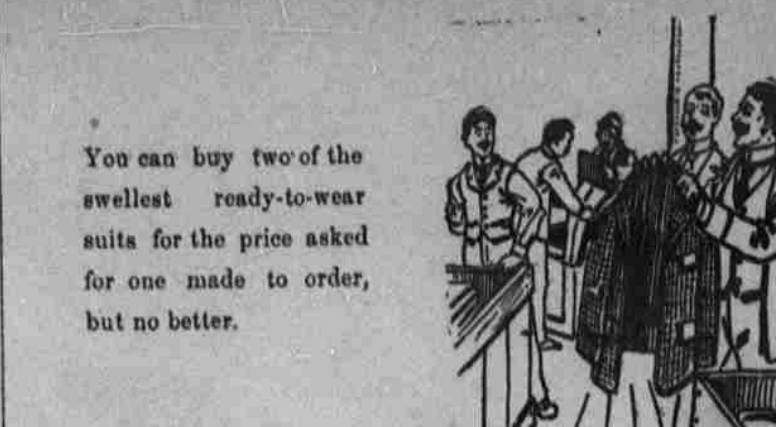
