THE ELECTION.

A Republican Victory in Gilliam County. W. L. Wilcox the Only Democrat Elected.

The election on Monday passed off quietly in Condon as it did all over the county. The republicans captured all the county offices with the exception of that of sheriff, W. L. Wilcox, democrat, being returned to that office by a large majority. The newly elected officers are as follows:

S. G. Hawson, representative; W. J. Mariner, county judge; J. W. Dyer, commissioner; W. L. Wilcox, sheriff; H. N. Frazer, clerk; S. B. Barker, treasurer; M. O. Clarke, assessor; W. W. Kennedy, school superintendent; T. L. Stewart, surveyor; H. R. Ready, coroner. They are all excellent gentlemen, and, judging by the past record of those who are at present serving the county in an official capacity, the affairs of the county will be safe in their hands.
