He earned $\$ 01,200$ durtng the senson of 1897 , from April $\delta$ to Oot. 80 . Next after hlm came Reverte, with \$28, ,700; Mazzantlnh, with \$20,000; Bombita, with $\$ 25,800 ;$ Algabeno, with $\$ 23$, 000; Fueates, wht $\$ 10,500$; Minuto. with \$15,000; and Vilita, with $\$ 10,000$, Premler Canovas' salary was 85,400 a year. There were during the season 438 performances, tn which 1,218 bulls, worth $\$ 300,000$ were ktlled. Over 0,000 borses perished in the fighta. These figures Include only high-class bullfighting at the moat important eltles.
