Rail Road for Condon.

The following letter has been handed to us for publication. The letter has been withheld from the public for some time in order to give parties interested an opportunity of feeling the pulse of the wheat growers of the county as to how they feel toward the proposition of securing better transportation facilities than they now enjoy.

Dear Sir:— I am in receipt of your letter of the 24th inst., and beg to advise that this company's corporate limit extends from Blazes to Prineville, Oregon. To build a line to Condon would practically necessitate a new organization at considerable expense.

What is the area now under cultivation and tributary to a line in the vicinity of Condon? About how many bushels of wheat do you raise to the acre? what was total number of bushels of grain raised during the last three years, show each year separately? what is the population of Condon, Mayville, Fossil, also of your county? how much stock do you ship, about how many carloads yearly?

What is the topography of the country between Arlington and Fossil? what per cent of your county is naturally tributary to Arlington and which we could not expect to handle with a line through Condon to the John Day river at or near Cottonwood?

A railroad to your country at this time means a great deal to the farmer. We are on the eve of a good healthy boom, which baffles description, and the country affording the best transportation facilities will undoubtedly reap the greatest benefit.
