**QUAY, THE BOSS.**

Pennsylvania's legislature continues to ballot for a senator, with Matt Quay in the lead. But as the criminal judge before whom the ex-senator is undergoing trial for the unlawful conversion of bank funds has admitted the now famous "red book" of the defunct bank in evidence, Quay's senatorial boom will go glimmering.

Counsel for the accused have fought the admission of that book tooth and nail, from which may be inferred that it contains facts and figures clinching the conspiracy charge against the political boss. In truth yesterday's press dispatches say that the acquittal of Quay is decidedly problematical. And for that reason the republicans in the legislature will, in all likelihood, agree upon another man before many more days are consumed in futile balloting.

Many people may wonder how a man like Quay, with his accredited shrewdness, could entrap himself as he has. The fact is, most political bosses descend to such questionable methods to gain power that, in the long run, their moral sensibilities, if they had any at the outset of their political career, become calloused. And when they reach the zenith of that power they believe themselves superior to the law.

The worst case of this type was that of "Boss Tweed, who, with the most refreshing and unconcealed impunity, robbed New York city of a hundred millions. When confronted by public opinion, he coolly inquired, "What are you going to do about it?" However his Nemesis eventually overtook him, and he died in prison.

But the hiliptians of his class, these later days, do not seem to profit by the fate of the most princely bandit ever known in American official life.—Telegram.
