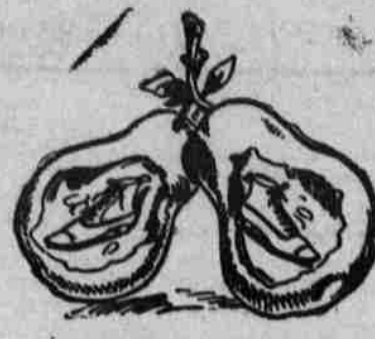
MAYVILLE.

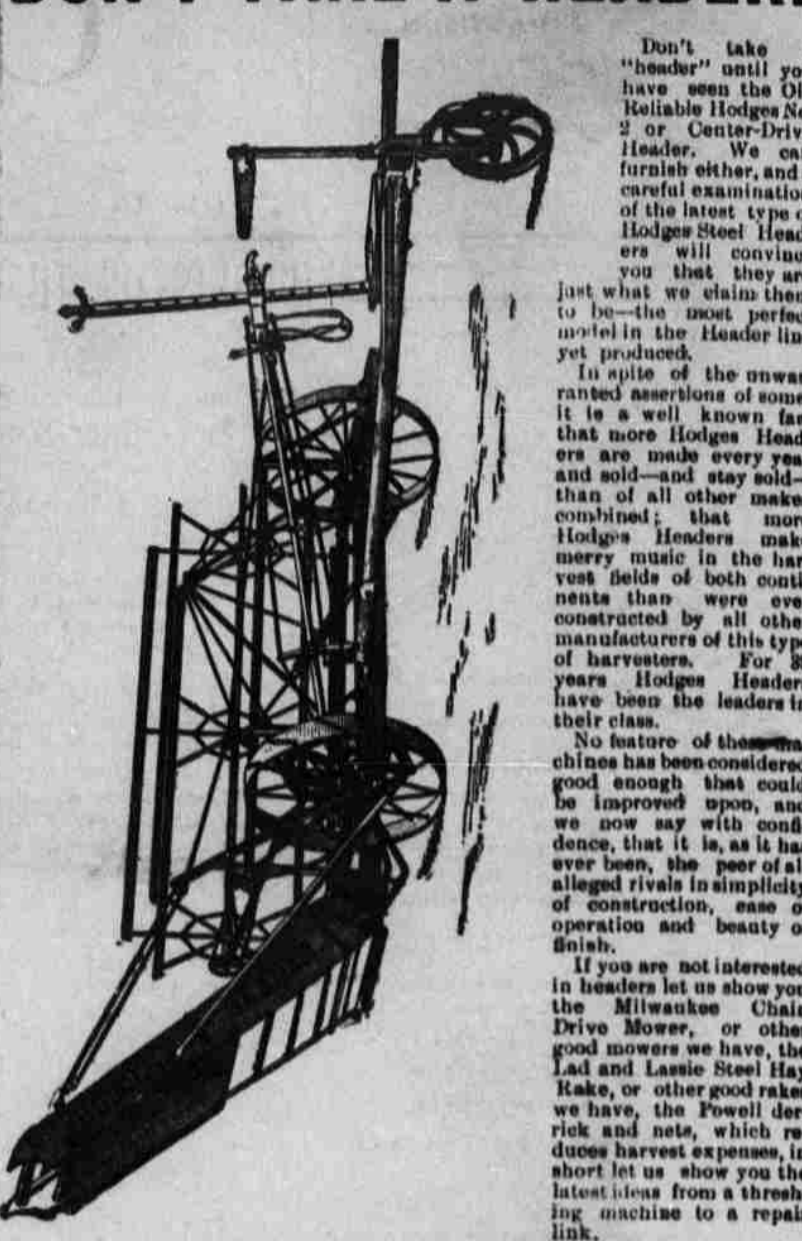
