Notice of Teachers' Examination.

Notice is hereby given that the board of examiners for Gilliam County will hold the regular examination of applicants for teachers' certificates in Condon, Oregon, on August 9, 10, 11 and 12, 1899, as follows:

FOR STATE PAPERS. Commencing Wednesday, August 9, at 9 o'clock A. M., and continuing until Saturday, August 12, if necessary. It is not thought that any applicant will desire to take the full examination for State papers and if they do the work could probably be finished on Friday, August 11th.

Wednesday—Penmanship, history, spelling, algebra, and reading. Thursday—Written arithmetic, theory of teaching, grammar, book-keeping and physics.

Friday—Physiology, geography, mental arithmetic, composition, physical geography. Saturday—Botany, plane geometry, general history, English literature and psychology.

FOR COUNTY PAPERS. Wednesday—Penmanship, history, spelling and reading. Thursday—Written arithmetic, theory of teaching and grammar. Friday—Geography, mental arithmetic and physiology.

FOR PRIMARY CERTIFICATES. Wednesday—Penmanship, spelling and reading. Thursday—Art of questioning, methods and theory of teaching.

The state board of education has decided that an applicant for a state paper need not write on all branches required for the same at any one examination. The work may be made to extend over three consecutive examinations, the applicant choosing the branches to be taken at each.

The state board of education has also decided that exemption from any branch on which an applicant has made 90 per cent or over at two successive examinations taken by such applicants, applies to examinations prior to August 9, 1899.

Two sets of questions will be provided on the ten branches required for a county certificate; one for applicants for state papers, the other for applicants for county papers. Applicants for primary certificates will write on the same questions (on the branches taken by them) as applicants for county certificates.

At this examination the law does not require the applicant to be examined in the Oregon school law, either for state or county papers, unless they are graduates of chartered institutions.

A fee of \$2.00 shall be charged for each applicant for a county or primary certificate and this must be paid whether the applicant passes or not. The fees thus collected go to the institute fund.

The State Superintendent has ruled that it would be illegal for the county board of examiners to issue a second or third grade certificate to an applicant who has previously held a second or third grade certificate; unless the applicant has not had the requisite teaching experience for the next higher certificate, in which case it would be legal for the county board of examiners to issue such a certificate. He also rules that it would be legal for county board of examiners to issue first grade certificates to applicants who have held first grade certificates.

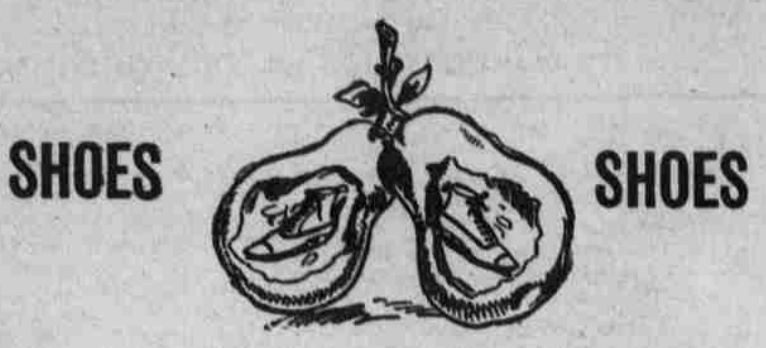

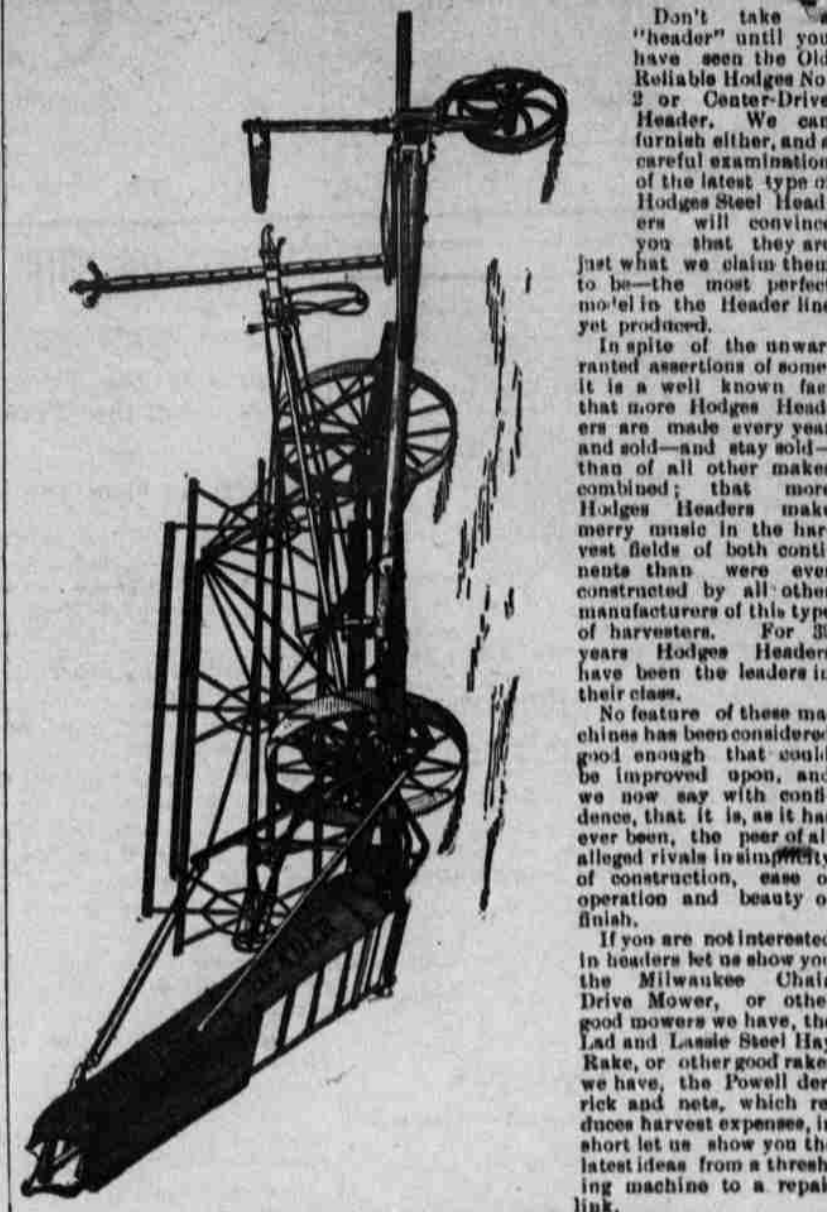
