Swine Plague. Communicated.

The hog trouble coming from Troutdale last fall and introduced on Rock creek was not hog cholera as at first supposed but swine plague which is highly contagious and almost as fatal but still it is not so hard to stamp out. Hog cholera is like typhoid fever in man while swine plague is more like pneumonia. They are two entirely distinct diseases and both need watching to kill on the germs of disease. All persons owning hogs should not visit diseased pens as there is great danger of carrying the disease. Swine plague can be treated more successfully than cholera but prevention is the best treatment in all troubles of this character. The following treatment is the best that we know of in this state and one that has been used very successfully and if used in time will in most cases prevent the spread of the disease. All treatment is of little use after the disease gets a good hold. All hogs that die should be buried at once. Treatment.

Wood charcoal.....1 lb.

Sulphur.....1 lb.

Soda hyposulphide.....4 lb.

Soda sulphate.....2 lb.

Antimony sulphide.....1 lb.

All must be well pulverized and thoroughly mixed. The dose is a heaping tablespoonful for every 200 lbs. of hog once a day, also from 10 to 20 drops of carbolic acid given once a day for every 200 lbs. of hog.

This treatment is more of a preventive than a curative nature and should be started early in the disease. The carbolic acid should be well shaken with water before being given. The hog pens should be well cleaned using plenty of lime white wash in which should be two big spoonfuls of carbolic acid, one spoonful of concentrated lye and the same of bluestone to every gallon of wash.

Use this freely and by careful watching the disease will soon be stamped out.
