The Celebration.

The largest crowd ever assembled in Gilliam county, if not in any county adjoining it, gathered in Condon last Thursday to witness the bill of the noble national bird and to help pull out his tail feathers. The event was a success beyond all reckoning. The eagle screamed, the band played, the festive fire cracker furnished fun, the dust flew, the babies cooed, the girls looked sweetly stanning and the ice cream stands raked in the shekels while the young men rapidly became financial wrecks.

The procession formed on the west side of town and marched through the principal streets with the Goddess of Liberty enthroned in regal statelyness upon the liberty car, surrounded by her 48 little maids of honor.

At the speaker's stand an immense crowd congregated to listen to the patriotic program. Hon. J. F. Pinkham presided as president of the day and after a few remarks by him, followed by an invocation by Rev. Edward Curran, and a patriotic song or two, the oration of the day was delivered by Hon. A. L. Vesale, of Portland.

Following the oration Miss Naomi Stangle recited "The American Flag" in a highly entertaining manner which was followed by other patriotic songs and the benediction by Rev. Curran. A noticeable omission from the program was the reading of the Declaration of Independence which has hitherto been considered an indispensable feature of every Fourth of July program.

Perhaps the old document has become a back number in this new 20th century. Who knows? The Ujijie raided the town after the program was over and, it is rumored, had a feast of roast missionary or something in the courthouse woodshed. They looked fierce and terrible enough to do most any thing any way.

In the afternoon the races were pulled off on the track on the west side and the usual amount of dust was eaten (and heat absorbed) by the spectators.

In the 100-yard foot race Bert Wall was the only man who got started on time and so won the money. Mrs. Wm. Harrison won the ladies foot race and Neel and Wineland, of Lone Rock walked away with the dough in the three legged race.

"Dolly Varden," a little sorrel filly, won the first money in the pony race and "Steve," a Fossil horse came in second. In the 300 yard horse race, "Mayflower" took first money and "Striker" second. "Daisy Downer" was in this race but her backers and friends claimed that she was crowded from the track by foul riding on the part of Mayflower's rider. The judges however awarded the money as above stated.

In the 500 yard race Friday "Daisy Downer," was an easy winner with "Dutch" second.

A number of match races were pulled off Friday and Saturday.

The base ball game Thursday afternoon between Condon and Fossil resulted in the usual amount of rag-chewing and in a tie, each side having 12 scores at the end of the 9th inning when darkness closed the game. The purse was divided.
