CIVIC PRIDE.

If a city, a town, a village or a school district is to keep up with the procession in this 20th century time, when the spirit of progress is on every hand, its citizens must possess a certain amount of civic pride.

Suppose the case in point to be a school district in a new and growing community. A few years ago the district contained 60 or 70 pupils. A two room school house and two teachers were then sufficient.

Such a condition would not exist in a district whose citizens possessed even a small amount of civic pride. Even the pride in appearances in the eyes of neighboring localities and of strangers who come among them to seek homes should prompt them to watch the changing conditions of their district and say, "This school house is too small; we must have a larger and better one and we must employ more teachers."

Or suppose the case to be that of an incorporated city, town or village. If the citizens of that town desire it to be a good town, a prosperous town, a progressive town, a desirable town in which to live and transact business and rear their families and to develop the best, rather than the worst traits of themselves and their children they must make it a town of which they need never be ashamed; they must have civic pride.

Every citizen who has that commendable pride will take a personal interest in the welfare of his town. He will watch the condition of the streets, the sidewalks and other public places. He will be interested in the purity of the water supply, the sanitary conditions, the fire apparatus and public order.

In each of the trains which are dispatched daily from Portland by the O. R. & N. Co. is to be found one of these "Pullman Ordinary Sleepers". The car attached to the "Chicago-Portland Special" goes through to Chicago without change, and the one in the "Atlantic Express" runs to Kansas City without change. Passengers in this car for Chicago change to a similar car at Granger.
