### Williamson Nominated.

Hon. J. N. Williamson, of Prineville, was nominated by acclamation in Portland yesterday to represent this district in Congress. When it was learned that Multnomah county would cast her 67 votes solidly for Williamson Mr. Moody's friends threw up the sponge and decided not to present their candidate's name to the convention at all. Multnomah is a pretty big county politically.

Hon. Thomas H. Tongue was renominated in the 1st district.

At the State convention yesterday W. J. Farish was nominated for governor, F. I. Dunbar for secretary of state and C. S. Moore for state treasurer.

### Republican Convention.

The republican county convention met last Thursday in Armory Hall. Most of the delegates arrived in town Wednesday afternoon and during the evening the leaders were busy trying to bring some order out of the confusion into which the bitter Moody-Williamson fight had thrown the party but without success. An effort was made to hold a caucus in the evening but that also failed so that when the hour for opening the convention rolled around no one seemed to know just what the result would be.

When the convention was called to order Geo. B. Duke, of Mayville president, a Williamson man, and C. A. Danneman of Rock creek, one of Moody's ardent supporters, were placed in nomination for temporary chairman and the ballot on that proposition showed the strength of each faction to a man. The vote stood 14 to 16 in Danneman's favor and showed that the friends of the present Congressman controlled the convention. J. F. Reinscher, also a Moody man was chosen temporary secretary and after the appointment of the regular committees and other routine work an adjournment was taken until 2 p. m.

At the afternoon session the temporary organization was made permanent and upon the adoption of the report of the committee on credentials the convention proceeded to the election of delegates to the state and congressional conventions and to the nomination of a county ticket.

The following gentlemen were placed in nomination for delegates to the state convention: Geo. Blake, W. H. Colwell, Jay Bowerman, C. A. Danneman, S. A. D. Gurley, Geo. Duke, J. B. Goff, and S. B. Barker. The first four named were elected by a strict factional vote. The delegation is for Moody and Geer.

The nomination of the county ticket was a tame affair, the only ballots which could be called close being for the four year commissioner and for clerk. The names of those nominated with their respective vote follows, the first named being the choice of the convention:

Judge—W. J. Mariner, 19; George Tatum, 8; Blank 2.

Commissioner (4-year term)—James Dyer, 16; Ralph Froman 14.

Commissioner (2-year term)—Ralph Froman, by acclamation.

Clerk—C. O. Portwood 16; E. W. Daggett 12; Blank 3.

Assessor—M. O. Clarke 20; — Montague 9.

Sheriff—W. H. Heron 15; Frank Wilson 9; J. J. Portwood 2; John Cunningham 2; Blank 1.

Treasurer—F. M. Pitter, by acclamation.

Coroner—A. H. Reedy, by acclamation.

Surveyor—R. H. Wain, by acclamation.

### Democratic Primaries.

The democratic primaries were held last Friday and were marked by no particular feeling or excitement.

In this precinct the meeting was held in Armory hall. John Downing was elected chairman and L. W. Darling secretary. The following delegates to the county convention were then elected: D. M. Rinehart, J. F. Cooke, C. S. Palmer, A. S. Rice, A. S. Hollen and S. S. Grider. A. S. Rice was nominated for constable, G. L. Neale for justice of the peace and W. C. Caldwell for road supervisor.

The delegates from Ferry Canyon precinct are Wm. Musgrove, S. B. Contrue, Blain Maley, Than Cavin, S. E. Van Vactor and Frank Palmer.

Those from Mayville are, Andrew Greiner, Paul Greiner, Ira Carter and C. L. Lillie.

From Arlington will come E. P. Weir, Charlie Shurte, Frank Louey and Geo. S. Smith.
