Extract from SUMMARY STATEMENT

Of the Financial condition of Gilliam county, Oregon, on the 31st day of March, 1902.

By estimated amount of unpaid taxes applicable to the payment of county warrants... \$1944.00

That is, this amount would be applicable to the payment of county warrants if it was collected and turned over to the county treasurer. But it has not been collected and, as a result, the taxpayers are obliged to pay interest on \$1944.00 which, at six per cent, amounts to \$1166.64 per annum. If the sheriff had collected this tax according to law during the past year the county would be in better financial condition. Taxpayers! Are you satisfied with this sort of mismanagement of county affairs or are you going to retire these old officials and try a new deal from a new set of men? It's simply a business proposition; figure it out for yourselves.
