A large number of Condonites went to Arlington last week to attend the democratic rally which was held there Saturday. They report an enthusiastic meeting and all agreed that Mr. Chamberlain's speech was a good one and calculated to make him votes. Most of the party returned Sunday.

Measles appear to be epidemic in this vicinity lately. The children of Otis Propst and New Madden are down with the malady in town and Frank Palmer's in the country are also victims. The start is supposed to have been brought from Walla Walla by the children of a sister of S. D. Fletcher who is here on a visit.

C. A. Danneman, of Clem, one of the republican candidates for representative, was in town during the week. Mr. Danneman is as jolly and jovial as ever and the fact of his being a republican does not detract from his good qualities as a citizen and a gentleman. There are three representatives to be elected from this district and this fact will probably make it possible for many voters to ignore strict party lines in making their selections to fill these positions.

H. J. Nott, Rev. Ed Baker and H. C. Schaffer, candidates respectively for the offices of clerk, sheriff and joint representative on the prohibition ticket, were in town Tuesday. Mr. Schaffer was billed to speak here that evening but on account of the republican rally he deferred his meeting until Friday evening when he will speak in the Baptist church. He is said to be a finished orator and a most entertaining speaker. They are all pleasant gentlemen and behaved well while in town and like the average candidate all insist they are going to be elected if they get enough votes.

The people of Condon turned out in a body Sunday afternoon to watch the ball game between the Condon and Mayville teams. Condon took the bat and Mayville the field. After the first two innings it was evident that the Mayville boys had the best of the game. The way those husky fellows struck the ball and spun around the bases was a caution. After Condon had played nine innings and Mayville eight the score stood 21 to 43 in Mayville's favor. The ninth inning was not played and no doubt the Condon boys were glad of it. The return game will be played at Mayville June 8, and the Condon boys are making some dire threats of bringing Mayville's scalp home with them.
