## SOME CORRECT IDEAS.

Hon. Walter M. Pierce, of Pendleton, recently elected joint senator for Umatilla, Union and Morrow counties, was in Baker City a few days ago and while there outlined some of the legislation he will advocate during the next session of the legislature. One of his themes is that all insurance companies doing business in the state, excepting fraternal and co-operative associations, should be taxed for the benefit of the public school fund. This is an idea that will meet the approval of a large majority of the people because it is just and right. Another thing Mr. Pierce is interested in is the revision of the incorporation laws, providing that every corporation whose home office is in Oregon shall be incorporated in this state, thus retaining to Oregon the fees that belong here.
