TWO PLANS FOR ENDING THE COAL STRIKE.

At the conference between representatives of the United Mine Workers and the coal operators which was called by President Roosevelt and which met at the White House last week two plans were submitted for ending the strike and averting the awful consequences which are threatened by an impending winter coal famine.

The plan submitted by President Mitchell, of the United Mine Workers was as follows:

"Confident of our ability to demonstrate to any impartial tribunal the equity of our demands for higher wages and improved environment, we propose that the issues outstanding in this strike shall be referred to you and a tribunal of your own selection, and we agree to accept your awards upon all or any of the questions involved.

President George Baer, of the Reading Railway, who is recognized as the leading spirit among the operators expressed his views on the situation in the following:

"There is a lawful way to secure coal for the public. The duty of the hour is not to waste time negotiating with the fomenters of this seditious and insolent defiance of law, but to do as done in the War of the Rebellion, restore the majesty of the only guardian of a free people, and to re-establish peace and order at any cost."

There is a marked difference in the views of these two men. President Mitchell who speaks for the workers, is confident of the justness of his cause and proves such confidence by offering to submit all of the questions involved to President Roosevelt and a tribunal to be named by him and agrees to accept the decision as final. His plan is moderate, conciliatory, humane. He recognizes the gravity of the situation and is willing to do anything that he can do, in justice to the cause of the people whom he represents, to end the present strike and relieve the distress which is even now being felt in the East.

President Baer's utterances are in marked contrast to those of Mr. Mitchell. Baer knows no cares nothing about justice. In effect he insolently demands of the president of the United States the crushing of the oppressed miners, whose poorly paid labor has wrung from the bowels of the earth the millions which he and his associates have amassed, by the strong arm of the federal military forces. He refuses to treat or confer with his workmen in the settlement of the differences, and asks the government to send an army of soldiers out to shoot them down like dogs, because they dare to demand of him living wage and such treatment as is supposed to be due every citizen of this republic.

Baer and his ilk care nothing for the public. It is a matter of no

concern to them if half the people in the east should freeze to death because of the strike. They want the strike settled by force so they may sell coal, but they refuse to consider the rights of either their workmen or the public in that settlement.

It is no wonder that there is a growing demand for government ownership of the mines. Such a thing would have been hooted at only a short time ago and denounced as anarchism, but already the conservative democracy of New York state have made just that demand in the state platform, while many of the leading newspapers and thousands of thinking people are advocating the same thing.

It begins to look as though that is about the only solution of the strike problem, and should it come to that in the case of the anthracite coal mines the way will be cleared for the nationalization of many other industries and Baer and Morgan and their ilk are the men who will be responsible for this step which is nothing short of socialism.

President Roosevelt, realizing the futility of further appealing to any fancied sense of patriotism or humanity in the millionaire coal kings, toward ending the coal strike and relieving the distress due to the coal famine, will appeal to the miners to return to work on the ground of the pressing necessity of the situation. It is ever thus. In the time of the Nation's need the working man is the one on whom Uncle Sam can depend. He goes forth to fight the battles while the capitalist of the Baer and Morgan stripe stay at home to gather in the shekels. These fellows expect the people (government) to protect their industries and business interests but when the government (people) needs any protection they allow the working men to furnish it. If the miners heed the president's appeal and return to work under promise of relief through a congressional investigation and if the promised relief fails to materialize, there will be trouble and serious trouble. The miners are in no frame of mind to stand any foolishness and who, that is fair minded can blame them.

Obituary.
Mrs. Grace Crane Jackson, wife of Orin Jackson, and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. W. Crane, of near Marville, died at Condon, Wash., on Wednesday October 1, 1902, as the result of a surgical operation which was made necessary by a severe attack of appendicitis. She was married almost a year ago to Mr. Jackson and they were living at Condon when she was attacked by her last illness.
