The report shows the outstanding warrants with estimated interest thereon to be \$32,549.17. The emuty's assets as shown by the report are: In hands of county treasurer \$23,931-.20; unpaid current taxes \$7,462.80; total 31,394.00. If these amounts were applied to the redemption of outstanding warrants it would leave the county debt only \$1,155.17 Clerk Portwood informs us that in making up the estimate of unpaid current taxes he did not take into account any taxes except the 1904 roll although there are unpaid taxes prior to that year amounting to about \$8,000. While no doubt, a large amount of these old taxes are now uncollectable on account of the lapse of time, still it in to make up the \$1,155.17 balance. 
