STILL DEFIANT AND INSOLENT.

Other mine operators have followed Barr in making statements, and they are fairly insolent in their tone, and in declaring what they will not do. They insist that they will do and should do nothing whatever; they will not raise wages; they will not reduce hours; they will not work coal instead of measuring it; and, above all, they will have no negotiations with nor yield any points whatever to the Miner's Union, as such. They simply notify the Commissioners, the President and the public, that they will not abide by the decision of the arbitrators, if they should in any material point be against them. If they persist in this the strike will be renewed, unless the arbitrators yield every point to the mine-owners and none to the miners; and even the miners would not long abide by such a decision. The operators seem to think that now the election is over they can mount their high horses again and ride rough shod over everybody. But if they are responsible for another prolonged strike, they need not expect a chance to arbitrate or receive reasonable proposals and terms of settlement. They will be disastrously fooled if they suppose they can juggle with and browbeat by turns the President of the United States and the Commissioners, appointed by him, and the American people, whose servant, executive and leader he is.—Telegram.

President Eliot, of Harvard, has lately been making all kinds of an ass of himself in his attacks on organized labor and his hero worship of the strike breaker or scab. His statement that he has "the most profound contempt for the man who is not willing to labor every day as long as his strength will permit," shows his calibre. Its a sure bet that if President Eliot is not owned body and soul by some corporation or combination that he was, in that speech, making a bid to become so. It is possible that Mr. Eliot, by his own statement, may feel obliged to hold himself in "contempt" as there is nothing to show that he labors every day and for as many hours as his strength will permit; if he did he would not have so much time to run around the country attempting to lecture on economic and sociological questions with which he does not seem familiar.

President Roosevelt's hunting trip to Mississippi, where he went in search of bear and cougar, may set a new fashion for the residents of that state. Of late years the best citizens down that way have given most of their attention to hunting and roasting "coons" and if the president can get them "switched" to bear and cougar the darkies can sure have a big old-fashioned Thanksgiving.

The Oregonian will cheerfully join in any movement of promise looking toward improved service, higher taxes and lower rates for Oregon and Washington railroads. Its files attest the uncompromising warfare it has unremittingly maintained against railroad abuses and railroad predation railroad inaction and railroad aggression, whatever and whoever the offender might be, and the best proof of it is in the fact that the railroads themselves are in a perpetual state of complaint at the attacks in these columns. But for all that we are unable to follow the curious process of reasoning by which Governor McBride and his supporters reach the conclusion that erroneous assessments of railroad properties can only be reached by a railroad commission. Here is the amiable and straightforward Spokesman-Review showing that while the Baltimore & Ohio is assessed at \$20,500 a mile in Indiana, the Northern Pacific, the Union Pacific and Great Northern are assessed at only \$6000 a mile in Washington. The comparison is obviously unfair; but suppose it is fair. Then what to do? Why, raise the assessment. This can be done either under the present system or by putting corporations of this general character under a State Board of Taxation or Equalization. That is the way

they have gone to work in other states. It is no proper province of a Railroad Commission to assess railroads or any other properties. Our political system provides for the election of other officers to whom assessment and taxation belong. A Railroad Commission is either an advisory or an administrative body designed to adjust grievances and improve traffic conditions, or else it is a mere machine at the disposal of ambitious politicians.

A New School Ruling.

Salem, Or., Nov. 12.—Superintendent of Public Instruction, J. H. Ackerman, today returned the following decision regarding the time when a person becomes a resident of a school district, so as to entitle the children to free tuition therein.

"The question has arisen as to the length of time required, after parent or guardian has moved into a school district before such a parent or guardian has gained a legal residence in such school district. In answer to this question, the department has ruled that as soon as the parent or guardian has moved into the district, with the intention of said school district his bona fide residence he becomes a resident of such district at once; and, hence, a child of such parent or guardian is entitled to free tuition from the time he moves into the school district.

"In case of doubt, it would be entirely proper for the district board to file an affidavit with the board setting forth his real intention as to residence. The intention of the parent or guardian is the controlling factor in determining his residence."
