Thomas Brackett Reed, of Maine, ex Speaker of the House of Representatives, died at Washington at an early hour Sunday morning. Mr. Reed was one of the foremost Americans of his time. He was a member of Congress for 22 years and as speaker of that body he corrected abuses and established precedents in parliamentary usage which will last as long as does this form of government.
