MAY PASS PORTLAND BY. The latest development in railroad circles is an apparrently well founded report that the Northern Pacific is to build a line down the north side of the Columbia to the mouth of that stream where a shipping point will be established in opposition to Astoria. This will mean the cutting off from Portland of a large amount of the wheat shipping business which that city now enjoys. While this situation is not calculated to make Portland feel particularly hilarious, it may be reckoned as a harbinger of better | coal trust kings into the crowded days for all the vast area of the Inland Empire, in that it will at least give this section the benefit of two lines of railway where heretofore of coal. one has monopolized the whole field. It is true that railroad companies have been known to combine for the maintainance of rates and they may do so again but still man. the two roads will no doubt serve the people a little better than one has done. But the most promisrng phase of the situation, as affecting the welfare of Eastern Oregon and Eastern Washington, is the effect it is already having on Portland with regard to the opening of the Columbia river to navigation. Portland has, in the past, been open to the charge of being half hearted and luke warm on the question of Upper river improvements. It has been suspected that her people feared that river steamers laden with wheat from the upper country might pass the mouth of the Will amette and steam on down to Astoria. This possibility may have deterred the metropolis from being over-zealous in working for an open river in the past but now that her old ally, the O.R.& N., is said to be ready to give her the marble heart and haul wheat direct to Astoria, there is a great awakening along the lower reaches of the Willametre on the subject of an open Columbia and on the importance of the development of the Inland Empire as related to the supremacy of Portland as a trade centre.
