

THE TWO MILE LIMIT LAW

Representative Burleigh, of Walla Walla county will introduce a bill during the present session which is known as the two mile limit law. It provides that no sheep shall be herded on government land within two miles of any dwelling or within one-half mile of any boundary line of any deeded land or claim belonging to any person except the owner of the sheep. The bill also provides that all stock herded or grazed in any county of the state except the county in which the owner of the stock resides, shall be taxed by the county with which it is grazed at the rate of 20 cents per head for sheep and one dollar per head for horses and cattle. A similar law has been in force in Idaho for a number of years and has been sustained by the courts of that state. The sheepmen of Eastern Oregon will put up a strong fight against the passage of this bill as it means the practical extermination of the sheep industry in Oregon. The bill is likely to cause plenty of trouble in the legislature and will put some of the legislators from stock counties in an embarrassing position. They will be between the devil and the deep blue sea and no matter which way they vote they will be sure to get "cussed" roundly by a goodly number of their constituents.

RECOGNIZE THE OSTEOPATHS

The osteopaths of Oregon will ask for "legal recognition" at the hands of the Oregon legislature this winter. At the present time this profession has no legal standing and, in the eyes of the law, does not rank as high as the barbers, who are recognized and protected by a special law.
