THE THO MILE LIMIT LYW

Representative Burleigh, of Wallows county will introduce a bill during the present session which is known as the two mile limit law. It provides that no sheep shall be herded on government land within two miles of any dwelling or within one-half mile of any boundry line of any deeded land or claim belonguing to any person except the ed appraisers owner of the sheep. The bill also provides that all stock herded or grazed in any county of the state except the county in which the owner of the stock resides, shall by the dounty within which it is grazed at the rate of 20 cents per head for sheep and one dollar per head for horses and cattle. A similar law has been in force in Idaho for a number of years and has been sustained by Mortgage Co.-\$10.72 allowed. the 'courts of that state. The sheepmen of Esstern Oregon will put up a streng fight against the practical extermination of the sheep industry in Oregon. The bill is likely to cause plenty of trouble in the legislature and will put some of the legislators from stock counties in an embarrassing position.
