Armory Hall Company Meets.

The annual meeting of the Armory Hall Company was held at the Globe office Monday evening. The report of the secretary and treasurer showed that there has been collected in rents during the past year the sum of \$549.42, besides \$100.00 yet to be collected making a total of \$649.42 earned by the property during the year. The hall has undergone extensive repairs during the year amounting to \$241.25 and back taxes which had been allowed to accumulate against the property to the amount of \$135.53 have been paid. F. M. Pitter was elected president for the ensuing year and P. H. Stephenson was elected secretary and treasurer. The secretary and treasurer was also made general manager of the company's business—to look after renting the hall collecting rents etc.
