Mr. Simmons is one of the in-charge operators and promoters of the new company and his present trip is made for the purpose of staking up the country through which the road is to be built.

He says his company has the best of financial backing in New York and that the road will certainly be built. All the company will ask of the people along the proposed line is free right-of-way and he says that if this can be secured a survey will be made early in the spring and work will commence on the line during the coming summer. Deeds to the right-of-way will not be asked for until the road is completed to the coast. The proposed western terminus of the line is at the mouth of the Siuslaw river in Lane county.
