ADVERTISING THE FAIR.

The Portland Telegram is somewhat worked up over the decision of certain of the country press in Oregon to consign to the wastebasket all free advertising "copy" even when the same has emanated from the Lewis and Clark Fair board. The Telegram is so very much in earnest in this matter that it has evidently forgotten its past "holly horror" of those unspeakably yellow sheets, the Hearst papers, and is now engaged in holding them up as bright and shining stars in the journalistic firmament and advising the country publishers of Oregon to take Mr. Hearst as an example in carrying out the business policy of their "small papers." Might it not be well for the Telegram to adopt Mr. Hearst's methods in conducting its own business? We understand that the Hearst syndicate contemplates sending a corps of special writers and artists to Portland to write up and illustrate our Fair—Why does the Portland paper not show its mettle by booming the St. Louis Fair on the same magnificent scale? Perhaps it can't afford it—it didn't have a millionaire for a father and cannot enter the race in Hearst's class. That is just what is the matter with the fellows who publish the small country papers. They cannot afford to conduct their business on the same scale that Hearst or even the Telegram does.

The Telegram says that publishers who demand pay for publishing the stuff sent out by the Fair board want to be paid for publishing the news. The paper is mistaken. These sheets of boiler plate stuff, big enough to fill all the news space of the average country weekly, are not news and the Telegram knows it. Does that paper print such stuff? Not that anybody knows of.

The statement quoted from a Valley paper that the Fair "will prove as beneficial to all Oregon as to Portland," is simply rot and every sensible man who has given the subject a moment's thought knows it. The Fair will benefit Portland materially, directly, and the rest of the Pacific Northwest in a lesser degree and less directly. The country papers who refuse to carry the free boiler plate are not opposing the Fair. They are simply adhering to a certain business policy which is aimed at grafts in general and free ads in particular. They will publish news of the Fair too as space will permit and as, in their judgement, their readers will appreciate, but they will not fill their papers with long winded articles from any advertising agent, to the exclusion of local news, unless they are paid for the space. The newspaper man who has not sufficient brains to write his own Fair "copy" would better quit the business.

Why don't the Telegram tell the country publisher why he should run free stuff for the Portland Carnival, and the Salem Fair? That's what this trouble started about.

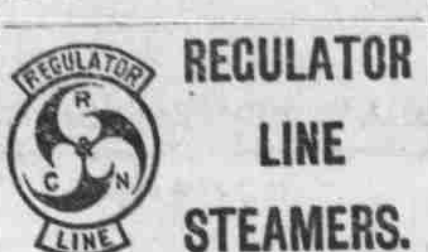
