Circuit Court Proceedings.

The regular September term of circuit court was called to order Monday morning with Judge Bradshaw on the bench. District Attorney Menefee, Court Stenographer Dufur and attorneys Bowerman, Snover and Darling, of Condon, Van Vactor, of Heppner, Handricks and Collier, of Forest, and Robinson, of Lone Rock, were also present.

Considerable routine business was disposed of during the forenoon and the case of J. H. Duncan, charged with the larceny of wheat, was set for 1:30 p. m. A jury was empaneled at that hour and the case about to be proceeded with when a surprise was sprung by the defendant through his attorney, S. E. Van Vactor, withdrawing his former plea of not guilty and entering a plea of guilty. The court named Wednesday morning at 9:30 as the time for sentence when Duncan was given a term of two years in the penitentiary.

The case of Reuben Pigg, charged with the robbery of F. B. Golden and Henry Allen at Orem, last October, was then proceeded with, the following jury being selected: A. L. Hoff, C. P. Polard, Ed Morgan, J. N. Pindexter, Wm Campbell, L. B. Townsend, H. K. West, T. B. Ferguson, L. C. Linbeck, Abe Morer, C. W. Martin and John Cunningham.

Evidence adduced by the State went to show that Golden and Allen were camped at Orem when the robbery was committed; that when they awoke in the morning their money and watches were missing and that a few hours later the watches were found in defendant's grip at his camp a short distance from the scene of the robbery.

The defense introduced but one witness—the defendant himself—and his story was that a stranger came to his camp early in the morning and, after some preliminary skirmishing, a swap was effected whereby the defendant became owner of the two stolen watches in lieu of one time piece he had formerly possessed. He never saw the stranger before and never heard of him since and no one else could be found who had so much as heard of him. The case went to the jury at 7 p. m. and it was midnight before a verdict of guilty was brought in. The defendant being without an attorney the court appointed J. W. Snover to defend him and such an ingenious and plausible defense did that gentleman put up that on the first ballot the jury stood seven for acquittal to five for conviction. As the night wore away, however, the sentiment changed and a verdict of guilty was brought in. Pigg was sentenced yesterday morning to 18 months in the penitentiary.

A Grand Jury was empaneled Monday composed of the following gentlemen: C. A. Danneman, C. W. Wester, T. M. and Geo. Taylor. Tuesday morning they filed the following report:

GRAND JURY'S REPORT.

We the Grand Jury beg to submit our final report as follows:

We have been in session two days and have reported into court one not a true bill.

We have examined the County jail and County buildings and found the same well kept and in as good repair and condition as could be expected considering the removal of the jail and the unfinished condition of the new court house now in course of construction.

We have also examined the books and records in the clerk's sheriff's and treasurer's offices and find the same well kept and correct so far as we were able to judge from our limited investigation. We heartily commend the efficient manner in which the County officers discharge the duties of their respective offices and their courteous treatment of the public generally.

We would call the attention of the County Court to the funds in the hands of the County treasurer and recommend that all monies on hand, not otherwise appropriated, be kept paid out in the redemption of County warrants.

Having finished all the business before us we respectfully ask that our report be accepted and that we be discharged.
