**THE RAILROAD OUTLOOK.**

The indications for the early completion of a railroad into Gilliam county were never so promising as at present. With three companies in the field, each one declaring that they will surely build a road from Arlington to Condon, and that they will commence work in the immediate future, the outlook is certainly favorable. It amounts to a moral certainty that only one of these companies will finally do business here, therefore the question of most interest to the people just now is: Which one will ultimately win out in the game and build the road?

Assuming that all three of the companies are acting in good faith and that they each expect to build the road it may be interesting to consider briefly their status, so far as it is known, what they have so far accomplished and their apparent ability to prosecute the work to a successful issue.

The company represented by Mr. Morris and his associates, who are now in Condon, has, we are informed, secured the survey and right of way acquired by Elrod & Moore, two years ago. They admit their inability to build the road without the support and assistance of the people of this county but do not ask for any subsidy or donation. They ask the people of this county, however, to subscribe for a certain amount of the company's bonds, agreeing to redeem the same within five years with six per cent interest added. They have, as yet, no traffic arrangement with the O. R. & N.

The company of which Messrs Findlay and Simmons are the head was incorporated about a year ago. They have made a partial preliminary survey of the route with some estimates of cost of construction. Their representative visited New York last summer and the report is current here that their project has been satisfactorily financed by New York capitalists and that all that is now holding them back from active work on the line is the lack of satisfactory traffic arrangement with the O. R. & N. These gentlemen have not yet indicated what concessions, if any, they will demand from the people of this county.

The third company, that of which John C. Ainsworth, of Portland, is president, was organized about two months ago. Associated with Mr. Ainsworth in this project are Lewis Gerlinger and Henry F. Conner, and all these gentlemen stand high in business and financial circles of Portland. They have as yet done no work in the field but the fact of their having satisfactory traffic arrangements with the O. R. & N. gives them some advantage in the game. These gentlemen declare that they will build and that they will do so without one dollar in subsidies from the people of this county.

Now, the question is, which company will build the road? This paper cannot answer that question authoritatively just now. It's like the old game the children used to play: "Button, button, who's got the button?"

The Portland Carnival cleaned up \$5000 on a twelve day run. Pretty good. The country publishers who advertised the show cleaned up—nit. Pretty bad.
