May Survey Soon

Information from Portland received a day or two ago is to the effect that the railroad company of which John C. Ainsworth is president, is rapidly perfecting its plans and expects to put a corps of surveyors in the field within a few days. No further information was obtainable at this time. We hope, however, to be able to give some more definite information regarding the intentions of this company in the near future and hope it will be of a satisfactory nature.

President Simmons Hefe.

President Simmons, of the Arlington & Pacific R. R. Co., who in town a day or two last week in the interests of that company, L. O. Boleton, of Portland, a former merchant of Olex and who still holds large property interests in this county, was with him. The object of the gentlemen's visit was to acquaint the people of this county with the demands made by that company in the way of concessions. They ask the people of this county to acquire a right of way for the road through this county. This right of way is to be turned over to the company to be in turn turned over to the trust company which is to take up the company's bonds when the cash for construction will be forthcoming and work will commence. Mr. Simmons stated to the Globe that if the people of the county take hold of the proposition and secure the right of way that the company will get to work and build the first 80 miles between now and the first of the year. This would carry the road to some unknown point in the interior of Wheeler county. It would also require some quick work in railroad building. To float bonds, make surveys, grade, tie and lay steel on 80 miles of road, all within 11 weeks would be a feat, perhaps heretofore unparalleled in railroad building. But it can be done, Mr. Simmons says. Mr. Simmons also intimated during the interview that if the people of Olex and Condon did not ante and proceed to do business on the right of way proposition that he still build the road anyhow and place the track and the depots to suit himself without regard to the present location of the towns aforementioned. This will serve as a pointer to show which way the wind blows. Mr. Simmons says the road is certain to be built. The gentlemen left for Arlington Saturday morning.

Gambling Closed.

There was no sound of revelry Tuesday night. But Gilliam's capital had gathered then. Her gamblers and her tin horns, 'twas a sight.
