Wholesome Literature.

The value of good literature cannot be overestimated. It stands out as a beacon light, directing the mind of the observer to a better and nobler conception of life. This new idea of life acts as a mainstay, bracing the thoughts and actions of the person who is so fortunate as to have had the opportunity to read good literature and who, in reading it, has absorbed the soul and life of what he has read.

The term "good literature" here includes not only Shakespeare, Browning, Emerson, Dante and a host of other classical writers, but also all our standard works on ethics, philosophy, sociology, theology etc. Spencer is just as necessary for a complete appreciation of literature as is Shakespeare. So for Darwin, Fluke, Huxley, Rusk and others. The mind must not be satisfied with the views and inspirations of a limited set of authors, but must broaden out and generalize the ideas produced by all. This is the only way that literature will do the most good. And this is the only way that we can get an impartial view of the thousands of questions which are continually coming up and are discussed by these men. All good literature, no matter in what form it is written, has an ultimate meaning and this meaning is the life of that particular kind of literature. We find meanings applicable to all phases of life hid in Shakespeare. Emerson said that Shakespeare was inspired. No other man ever held such varied conceptions of life. Shakespeare could make his characters philosophers or fools. They represent all stages in life and more than this they represent these stages naturally. This is where Shakespeare's genius lies, and this is what makes him live now and will make him live so long as the hearts of the people are capable of responding to noble sentiments. Hamlet's soliloquy is philosophy; Portia's pleading to the Jew to be merciful is life and Caliban's gobbling in the Tempest is idiocy. Shakespeare touches every string of the human soul, producing vibrations that blend into the harmony of a complete whole. His best characters are transcendent in thought. They are beautiful in their conceptions; so beautiful that the "transient gleams" now and then brought forth, give to the reader a new lease of life. They give to us moods as variable as those we might catch from the grandeur and loftiness of some snow capped mountain, to the dreariness of a barren waste. No other man has ever equaled Shakespeare in his peculiar style of thought, in his ability to play with words and in the personality of his writings. Those who have read Shakespeare and got the soul of what he has written are better men and women. To come in touch with such a man is to be akin to the conservative elements in life and these are the elements which promote the general wel-

fare. Herbert Spencer was a mathematician and his arguments cannot be torn down. They stand out clear and lucid, every link joining the preceding one, making a complete chain. They are keen and penetrating and based upon principles which are accepted as truths. Spencer and his colleagues represent a new era in human thought. This new era is the investigation of truths unhampered by pre-existing assumptions and conclusions.

De-prive a man of his power to think freely and he is but little better than a brute. The free exercise of thought must be allowed if the greatest advancement is desired in human progress. It is only necessary that this thought should be pure and logical. As education advances men drift more and more into the views held by such men as Spencer. To become acquainted with such a class of authors develops a stability of thought and feeling and creates a sense of mastery unequalled by any other style of literature.

Probably no other author is cherished in the hearts of the American people as is Emerson. Emerson wrote in advance of his time as a number of our best men have done. At the time Emerson wrote he was ridiculed and laughed to scorn by the majority; now he is quoted from the pulpit by our best preachers. This shows that a great evolution in thought has taken place and is now taking place. As civilization advances man's conception of a religion must also advance. Science has changed our knowledge of nature's laws from a jumbled mass into a scientific precision. It has changed man's conception of a universe made up of one world with a blue dome overhead, into millions of worlds floating through infinite space. This is why Emerson is appreciated now more than ever. He saw in nature everything that led to right living. He was both a philosopher and a poet. His conceptions were beautiful and his ideals practical. He saw what no other man has probably ever seen or ever will see completely. He rose far above the ordinary plane of existence and seemed to catch, at times, the far away gleam of the Infinite.

Such men as Emerson are invaluable additions to the progress in thought. They open up new fields, new ideas, new conceptions, a new life in which mankind may roam and make independent investigations. They encourage free thought, which is as necessary for advancement as food is for life.

Literature, after all, represents one of the greatest achievements of a nation. After all else is dead good literature will live. The wealth of a nation is no more an end in itself than is the wealth of an individual. It is merely a means to an end. This end is a higher civilization, progress in all lines, the chiefest of which is art. The most enduring of all the arts is good literature. It is the standard by which the progress of a country is measured. It is a torch, illuminating the past and revealing to mankind the sentiments, ideals and life of a nation.
