A High Class Entertainment.
The recital given by Miss Maude Carlisle, of Arlington, and Miss Elma Byrne, of Salem, last Friday evening was attended by a fair sized and appreciative audience. Miss Carlisle is one of the most accomplished pianists in the state and Miss Byrne is equally accomplished as an elocutionist and reader. The young pianiste showed rare skill in her rendition of difficult classical selections from the masters her tone and expression being excellent. Miss Byrne's elocutionary work was also highly enjoyed by the audience. Her selections from Lew Wallace and her humorous impersonation of a school boy were perhaps enjoyed more than the others though all were good. Altogether it was one of the best entertainments that has been given in Condon in a long time.

Struck Oil.
The well drill of the Condon Drilling Co., which is being operated on Dunn Bros. ranch northwest of town, struck a strata of blue shale or soapstone at a depth of 72 feet last Friday from which is obtained a small amount of apparently good oil. A considerable quantity of the oil was brought up with the first bucket of water raised when the well was being end pumped and the greasy fluid also adheres to the drill stem to such an extent that when the drill was allowed to rest on a plank over the well over night the oil trickled down enough to saturate the plank. The oil is dark colored and heavy and gives off the well known petroleum odor which cannot be mistaken. The strata of soapstone is about three feet in thickness and after passing through it a vein of quartz containing a considerable amount of copper and iron was encountered. This formation is very hard and the drill could make but slight progress in it. Jim Dunn informs us that rock and quartz containing considerable copper status has been encountered all the way down the well as well as some strata of white quartz crystals. The formation seems to be rather unusual for this country and it may yet result in disclosing hidden mineral wealth beneath the rich surface of old Gilliam county.

This is not the first well drilled in Gilliam county which has disclosed the existence of oil. Several other deep wells have shown traces of the product and it is not beyond the range of possibilities that if the country is ever prospected by a really deep well the result may be the discovery of important mineral wealth. The theory that no mineral wealth of any importance can exist beneath a productive surface has been exploded years ago.
