How We Progress.

The year which closes tonight has been marked by the greatest degree of progress of any twelve months in the history of Gilliam county. A large area of fertile farm land has been brought into cultivation and many improvements of every description have been the order of the day. Farm houses, and barns have been erected, miles of fencing built, orchards have been planted and stock and herds are being constantly improved by judicious breeding. The people of Gilliam county are not of the class satisfied with the achievements of past years but with each succeeding twelve months they expect to make some further progress in bettering their surroundings than they did in the year last passed.

Condon has made a phenomenal growth during the past year. Among the important improvements of the year the new court house stands at the head. The building is a beautiful structure and is admired by every visitor to the town. It is of red brick with white brick trimmings and is substantial and complete in every respect.

Next in importance is the new school building which has just been completed. It is a modern two-story frame building of four rooms, well lighted and comfortably arranged for the accommodation of pupils and teachers. The building is substantially constructed and well lighted and is an ornament to the town. Mr. S. S. Grider, the well known builder, has had charge of the work and the finished job is one of which he may be proud.

A large number of smaller dwellings, barns and other buildings have also been added to the town during the year.

Another important improvement is the electric light plant which has just been put in operation by the Condon Milling Co. The business houses and many of the residences are now lighted by electricity and the large number of customers with which the new plant started out shows that the people of Condon appreciate modern and up-to-date improvements.

The reason for this activity in building in Condon is not hard to discover. The town is surrounded by the most fertile wheat lands in the Northwest. The country is being developed and is pushing the town ahead.

Real estate has advanced steadily during the year. Farming lands are selling at from \$50 to \$100 per acre and the location and amount of improvements determining the price.

There are but few opportunities left in this county for home seekers but for the man with a little capital the outlook was never more promising. The price paid for farm lands is still reasonable, the value of the soil has been determined beyond question and the outlook for further and more rapid advance in realty value was never so promising.

The county has taken her first really long stride forward during 1906 without a home and from that kind of progress there will be no recession. The indications now are that Condon will enjoy a greater growth in 1907 than it has in 1906 and this will be because the surrounding country demands it. Condon is not "booming" it is only keeping pace with the rich wheat fields which surround it on every side and wave their wealth of golden grain in a friendly banner to the town to "get a hustle on" and make of itself a town worthy of the surrounding fertile fields.

Christmas was celebrated at Condon in much the same manner as the time honored festival has been kept in times past. On Christmas eve at the Baptist, Saint's and Congregational churches tastefully decorated trees had been prepared for the children of the Sunday schools and many elegant presents and much candy and nuts were distributed.

Parker Captured.

T. W. Parker, the smooth "liver," who escaped from Detective Joe Day from an O. R. & N. train last week while enroute from Helena, Montana, to Portland to answer for his crime, was nabbed at this place Thursday night by Sheriff Johnson and Marshal R. McKinney.

Parker left the train at Arlington and struck out for the interior taking breakfast at Win. Head's place on Rock Creek. There he was recognized by the tattoo marks on his hands and Mr. Day was notified. He at once notified the officers at Condon and they were on the look out for him. He reached town about dark and after taking supper at the Palace hotel he went to the Condon hotel and engaged a room. There the officers found him and he was taken into custody without resistance. It was 11 o'clock when the officers entered his room and Parker was found fully dressed hiding behind the door. It is probable he was getting ready to leave when arrested. He was taken to Portland Saturday and turned over to the Multnomah county authorities.
