J. A. Henderson, the well known pioneer of this county, now a resident of Fossil, was in town for a few hours Monday looking after business matters and while here was a pleasant caller at the Globe office. Mr. Henderson says the coal prospect south of Fossil is looking well and the owners believe that they have found an extensive and valuable deposit of that mineral. A shaft is also being sunk at Fossil and while no coal has been struck there as yet the indications are very good for finding it at a greater depth. Mr. Henderson believes that if the people interested in coal development there would secure a diamond drill and go down in a systematic manner they might uncover some valuable mineral deposits.

Dell Cummings, of near Olex, was in town last Friday and Saturday having with him his pet eagle which he captured several months ago before it was old enough to fly and has since raised by hand. The noble bird is apparently full grown now and is tamer than any barn yard fowl. At the ranch the eagle is given full liberty to go and come as it pleases and it frequently makes extended excursions but never fails to come home to roost. Some time ago it returned to the ranch accompanied by another eagle and by a little strategy Mr. Cummings succeeded in capturing the visitor but he has not been so successful in taming it. It resents too much familiarity and cannot be tamed at large. Mr. Cummings has been offered \$25 for the tame eagle but refused the offer.

War is On.

Japanese torpedo boats slipped into the harbor at Port Arthur Monday night and attacked the Russian warships stationed there disabling three vessels. The Japs escaped without a scratch. Another big battle is expected at any time.

Mill Deal Closed.

W. N. Brown is now the sole owner of the Condon Milling Co.'s property a deal having been closed Tuesday by which that gentleman acquired the 1/2 interest of his former partner, A. S. Hollen. The consideration was \$9,000.00. Mr. Brown will at once proceed to incorporate the property and will offer a portion of the stock for sale.

Should Publish Assessment Roll.

Representative Danneman, while discussing the tax law the other day stated that he is in favor of a law which will provide for the publication of the assessment roll in the county newspapers prior to the meeting of the county board of equalization in each year. This publicity, he believes, would have a salutary effect in helping to restrain the professional tax dodger in his old practice of giving in but a modicum of his property to the assessor and would do much toward equalizing the burdens of taxation. Mr. Danneman says his attention was first directed to this plan by an editorial suggestion in the Globe a short time before the late special session. He gave the idea considerable thought and after reaching Salem mentioned the matter to other members who were favorably impressed with its feasibility but, on account of the extreme shortness of the session and the rush of other business, it was thought advisable not to attempt to embody it in the present law but to let the matter go over until the next regular session. Mr. Danneman believes, however, that it will be taken up at that time and will become a law.

School Notes.

Teachers and pupils are much pleased with the new building and better conveniences.

The teachers held a meeting in the principal's room last Saturday and adopted a few general rules for the management of the schools.

President Wilcox visited the school Monday. He gave us a very interesting talk concerning the cost of the new building and its furniture. His remarks were such as should create local pride.

Another Blalock Burglar.

Blalock is not the biggest town on earth and in the past its greatest claim to greatness has been the fact that it is the home of ex County Judge Mariner who for so many years presided over the destinies of Gilliam county as the head of the county court which used to hold its bi-monthly sessions in the little old shack which, by courtesy was called a court house. Lately, however, the peaceful village has been making ready for bold burglars and Judge Mariner's store has been the favorite point for these worthless' depredations.

A few weeks ago three men were arrested by Wasco county officials charged with burglarizing the Blalock store and they are now lodged in the county jail awaiting trial. Last Sunday another victim was brought to Condon charged with the same offense. The next arrival is believed to be a Russian and he is, perhaps, as well satisfied to be elected to spend the remainder of the Winter in Gilliam county's elegant hotel de skookum as if he were on the other side of the broad Pacific filling an engagement as a target for the Japs. The sheriff is of the opinion that the subject of the case may be "all wool and a yard wide but he won't wash" and that official's sermon last Sunday from the text, "Cleanliness is next to godliness, did not apparently fall on fertile soil.

If Blalock keeps up her lick in furnishing inmates for the county jail she will soon rival Portland as a tough town to say nothing of the possibility of the county going broke in the payment of criminal court charges and the transportation of prisoners from the extreme northwest corner of the county to the county seat. Perhaps, after all, it would have been better if the new court house and jail had been located at Blalock rather than at Condon. The jail and court would have been right at the base of supplies and the heavy transportation charges of suspects would have been avoided.

John Day Claims Another Victim.

O. N. McCaleb, a deputy sheriff of Sherman county, is the latest victim of the treacherous currents of the John Day river. Clyde Flint, of Ajax, brought word of the fatal accident to town Sunday.

Mr. McCaleb resided at Moro but he had a homestead on the John Day near the mouth of Devil's Canyon, his residence being on the west side of the stream. He came down to the claim to spend a day or two last week and not returning at the appointed time his friends became uneasy and instituted a search which resulted in the finding of his lifeless body in the river about 100 yards above the mouth of Devil's Canyon. The body was found Saturday and in the indications were that he had been dead for several days. The supposition is that Mr. McCaleb had gone out to hunt geese along the river and had shot one which fell in the water. In attempting to wade out to secure the game it is probable the unfortunate man was seized with cramp and was unable to regain the shore. He was last seen alive Wednesday about noon when Mr. Flint saw him from a distance, near his cabin. Deceased was a respected citizen of Sherman county.
