DYNAMITE AND THE BOY-COTT.

The office of the Long Creek Ranger was destroyed by an explosion of dynamite the other night the building and plant being almost a total loss. It is supposed that some enemy or enemies of the editor, failing in other efforts to "put him out of business" resorted to the dynamite method as a punishment to him for failing to meekly submit to their desires and allow himself to be ruined financially by their more lawful but no less detestable methods. The publication of the Ranger was begun several years ago by a man who had opinions of his own on various subjects and who dared express them. This manner of conducting a newspaper, it is understood, did not meet with the approval of a certain element of the town and an attempt was made to "run him out." It is said that during the last campaign an aspirant for one of the county offices whose candidacy the Ranger failed to support or possibly opposed, organized a boycott against the paper, offering to furnish the money to pay up the arrearages of all persons who would stop their subscription. This method of disciplining refractory editors on the part of disgruntled politicians is, it may be said in passing, not confined to Grant county.

Having read the Ranger more or less since its first issue, we have formed the opinion that its editor stood for law and order and believed in enforcing laws as they appear on the statute books. We have also formed the opinion that he would not support any man for public office unless he was convinced that the man was honest and capable no matter how strong a pull the candidate might have.

The Ranger man may have had other faults but as near as we can size up the situation the two above mentioned were his principal ones in the eyes of his neighbor-enemies.

A newspaper has the same right to support or oppose a candidate for public office as the private citizen has and the man who seeks a lucrative position as a public official, under a government which claims to guarantee the freedom of the press, is in a mighty small business when he attempts to boycott a newspaper which has fearlessly and fairly opposed him. The same may be said of any class of habitual law breakers. They have no right to violate the law neither have they any right to boycott or persecute any citizen who has the courage to criticize their unlawful actions and who tries to uphold the law and if the people of that community are right minded and believe in justice and fair play they will never permit such persecution to prevail. The use of dynamite in this case was an outrage but it was no greater outrage than is the Loycott and other sneaking under-

hand methods so often employed by certain classes to ruin those whom they cannot control. The good citizens of Grant county should stand by the Ranger and see that it stays in Long Creek. They should stand to its back to a man and they shall leave no stone unturned to apprehend and punish the dynamiters.
