The air is filled with their incessant noise. The insect is the cicada, a species of 13 and 17 year locust. It lives in the ground in the form of a large white grub. As the time allotted for it to live in the ground nears an end it burrows to the surface, but in strict obedience to the laws of nature it stops just before breaking through the surface into the atmosphere and awaits nightfall. While you are sleeping the cicada breaks the crust and comes forth into the atmosphere.

It clings to the nearest bush or tree and clinging to the underside of a leaf undergoes the strangest transformation.

In the course of two hours it has crawled out of its own hide, shed its skin, so to speak, quit forever its habitments as a grub, and becoming clothed with wings with the morning sun, soon takes its flight, a beautiful cicada or locust. Singing merrily as it goes it leads a more happy and blithesome existence than it did as a great clammy worm. Have you seen their empty, hard, cast-off skins or shells hanging on the bushes or trees?

That is just the way with some of us. We are hide bound, groveling in the narrow channels of the earth, worms as it were, clothed in the hard skin of prejudice.
