CITY AFFAIRS.

As the time for the annual city election approaches numerous questions pertaining to the general welfare of Condon come up for discussion. Every citizen is directly interested in the material welfare the sanitary condition and the moral status of the town. It is proper, therefore, that every citizen should consider and discuss these matters at this time in order that they may be able to go to the primaries and help to select a city ticket which will be a credit to the city as well as a benefit to the property owners and tax payers.

Here are a few of the questions which are now being propounded: Is the old sewer, or waterway to be allowed to remain as it now is, a stench in the nostrils of the people a breeding place for typhoid germs and a continual menace to the health and life of the people?

Is Main street to remain a quagmire in winter and a dust heap in summer? Are the back yards and vacant lots to be allowed to remain in their present filthy and unsanitary condition?

Is the ordinance by which is established the street and sidewalk grades to continue to be a dead letter to suit the convenience of a business man who is a member of the present council and who elevates his sidewalk and puts in stairways in arrogant defiance of the law and of the convenience and comfort of the people?

Are the streets to continue to be obstructed by ramshackle buildings for indefinite periods simply to suit the convenience of a city official who "has a pull"?

Are the books of the city officials ever to be audited and an account rendered the people of the stewardship of their chosen servants?

These questions and others which are asked indicate that there is to be a municipal house cleaning in Condon in April.

THE LOCAL OPTION QUESTION.

The proposed "Local Option Liquor Law," which is to be voted upon at the coming election is arousing much interest all over the state and it seems probable that the contest at the polls on that question will be warmer than will be the fight over the election of any state official. The law has been proposed by the initiative petition such petition having been filed in the office of the secretary of state February 5, 1904, in accordance with the provisions of the initiative and referendum amendment to the constitution which was approved February 24, 1903.

The question to be voted upon at this time is not one of Prohibition vs. License. The matter to be settled now is whether or not a law shall be enacted by which the people of any county, subdivision of a county or a precinct shall be permitted to say directly, whether or not the saloon business shall be permitted. If the proposed law is adopted at the coming election, a direct vote upon the liquor question may be demanded in any county or precinct in the state by a petition signed by ten per cent. of the qualified electors of such county or precinct the same to be filed with the county clerk not less than 30 days nor more than 90 days before the day upon which the first vote is to be taken. The date upon which the first vote may be taken on the question of prohibition vs. license is fixed to be on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1904, (the day of the presidential election) and thereafter only on the first Monday in June of any year. The law shall take effect on the first day of January, 1905, in such counties or precincts in which the question shall carry next November and on the first day of July following the day of election thereafter.

When this question is voted on in any entire county and a canvass of the votes cast shows that the question failed to carry in the county as a whole it shall, nevertheless, be the duty of the county court to issue an order of prohibition for each precinct or subdivision of such county in which the question carried.

The question may be voted upon in any precinct or any number of precincts of a county which may desire to unite in a petition for an election but in no case shall any part of any precinct less than the whole of such precinct be included in any such subdivision or district of the county.

An election under this act may be demanded by any incorporated city or town or by any ward or wards of such city or town but in such a case the vote must be taken on the day of the regular city election.

The provisions of the general election laws of the state shall govern the application of this law so far as the same are practicable. As intimated above this law, if enacted, is not a direct prohibition measure. It simply provides a way by which the majority may regulate the liquor business in each county or precinct.
