Arlington 4, Lone Rock 2, Blalock 5, Matney 2, Condon 6, Mayville 3, Ferry Canyon 7, Rock Creek 4, Idea 1, Trail Fork 2, Willow Creek 2.
Being one delegate at large for each precinct and one for every 15 votes or major portion thereof cast for Supreme Judge at the last state election.
The primaries for the purpose of electing delegates to the county convention and for nominating precinct and district officers will be held at the usual voting places in the various precincts on Wednesday, April 13, 1904.
